A motion was made by Mr. Morris, seconded by Mr. Kehoe, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of October 11, 2012. The motion passed unanimously.

A. <u>LACERA Operations Briefing</u> Robert Hill

Messrs. Hill and Popowich presented the monthly briefing on LACERA's operations. Many of the following discussion items may recur in subsequent briefings or may result in a future comprehensive presentation.

B. <u>FY 2011-2012 Final Budget Control Report</u> Shamila Freeman, Kaelyn Ung

Shamila Freeman and Kaelyn Ung presented the final Budget Control Report for fiscal year 2011-2012, based on actual expenditures through June 30, 2012. Total operating expenses for the LACERA Administrative Budget were approximately \$50 million, an underexpenditure of approximately \$2.6 million from LACERA's operating budget.

The Retiree Health Care Benefits Program Budget's total operating expenses were approximately \$3.2 million. This represents an underexpenditure of approximately \$208,000 from the operating budget.

C. <u>Overpayment & Forgery Receivables (Period Ending September 30, 2012)</u> Gloria Harriel/Edward Wong/David Bayha

Gloria Harriel, Edward Wong, and David Bayha presented the status report on overpayment and forgery receivables for the six month period ending September 30, 2012. There are currently 411 overpayment and forgery cases. Overall, during the past six months we have decreased our overpayments by 57% to \$952,000, due in large part to the uncollectible write-offs totaling \$1.1 million approved by the Board in August, 2012.

III. FOR INFORMATION (Continued)

Overpayments are broken out into three categories:

• Death related as a result of late death notification

The majority of the cases are as a result of late death notification. This occurs when we are notified one or more months after the member is deceased. Deaths occurring outside of California usually take longer to be reported.

Miscellaneous

These are situations over which staff has no control, such as data system clean-up.

Both the death related and miscellaneous categories have decreased significantly during this period, once again due to the write-offs approved in August, 2012.

Incorrect computation

This area decreased 16% in this period to a balance of \$350,000. However, during the current period, this category has increased significantly. This is partially due to the fact that a more precise categorization has been made, with less cases in the Miscellaneous category and an increase in Incorrect Computation. Two cases alone amounted to roughly 50% of the dollar amount of this category. These errors were corrected quickly upon discovery and changes have been made to our procedures. A heavier emphasis is now being placed on the proactive development and implementation of internal controls which are more preventive in their design.
