A. <u>LACERA Operations Briefing</u> Robert Hill/JJ Popowich

Messrs. Hill and Popowich presented the monthly briefing on LACERA's operations. Many of the items highlighted may recur in subsequent briefings or may result in a future comprehensive OOC presentation.

- B. <u>The Rise & Pitfalls of BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) to Work</u> Michael Herrera *(oral presentation)*

Mr. Herrera discussed the benefits and risks of staff using their own mobile devices, such as iPads and iPhones, for business purposes.

Some benefits of employees using their own devices could be:

- Reduced employer costs
- Increased flexibility, productivity, and employee satisfaction
- Employee only needs to carry one device, for both business and personal use

Legal risks and challenges to be considered are:

- Security (risk of member data loss)
- Employee privacy
- Compliance with laws and regulations
- C. <u>LACERA Renovation Update</u> (oral presentation) Cynthia Guider

Ms. Guider presented an update on the current LACERA renovations. This includes the Disability Retirement expansion project, Communications relocation, and Human Resources and Training Center expansion.

Disability Retirement Expansion Project

Phase I

- Provide seven additional cubicles and three additional offices
- Install a "white noise" system to mask sound
- Temporarily relocate the file room to the conference room
- Staff Phase I move-in, July 11 Phase II
- Expand file room
- Targeted completion date is mid-August

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III. FOR INFORMATION (Continued)

Communications Relocation

- Relocate the Communications Division to the third floor
- Provide enhanced functional capabilities, with a dedicated studio/editing bay, and cubicles built to accommodate multiple system platforms
- Additional storage for equipment
- Project currently in design phase with targeted start date the end of September

Human Resources and Training Center Expansion

- Expand from one to two training centers, seating up to 16 staff each
- Upgraded technology and computers installed in each center
- Furniture designed specifically for training facilities
- Provide more space for Human Resources, including a multi-purpose room for interviews, orientations, confidential discussions with staff, etc., and additional storage space
- Dedicated Human Resources conference room
- Design phase will begin immediately after starting the Communications project

A large non-renovation project is currently in progress. The Member Services area is being reconfigured, installing 16 smaller cubicles for the training classes. This will provide an enhanced learning culture by placing all trainees in the same location. The estimated completion date for this is the end of July.
